SOUTH SOUND SEA HAWKERS DONATED TO FOUR CHARITIES

South Sound Sea Hawkers decided on the charities to which the club will donate at the November meeting. We selected four and each will receive a \$500 donation. We also had four more that we will support throughout the year and they will be eligible for donation next December.

The ones selected are:

FENCES FOR FIDO, an award-winning, non-profit organization that builds donor-funded fences free of charge for families who keep their dogs on chains, tethers and in small enclosures.

TREE HOUSE - MARY BRIDGE CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL, A Place for Families offers family housing right across the street from the campuses of MultiCare Tacoma General Hospital and Mary Bridge Children's Hospital.

TRUFANT FOUNDATION: Their mission is to help make dreams come true for disadvantaged youth and their families and to build a personal connection and involvement with individuals and community programs that provide service to people who are most in need.

I started this sock drive in the fall of 2016, with the help of the South Sound Sea Hawkers Booster Club. I was able to collect 400+ socks that year. Then in 2017 I kicked it off again and named it **S0CKS 1000.** And with the help of the Gig Harbor community, personal friends/connections and the help of South Sound Sea Hawkers, I was able to collect and distribute over 2100+ pair of socks. The donations went to: Faith House, St Francis House in Puyallup, St Vincent de Paul Our Lady Queen of Heaven Catholic Church, Gig Harbor Eagles Food Bank, Key Peninsula Family Resource Center, Family Renewal Shelter, Rainer View Christian Church program for the homeless, Shiloh Baptist Church program for the needy, Homeless encampments throughout Pierce County and various other programs that help others.

I started this sock drive in the fall of 2016 and was able to collect 400+ socks that year with the help of the South Sound Sea Hawkers and my personal friends and community. Then in 2017 I kicked it off again and named it **SOCKS 1000.** And with the help of the Gig Harbor community, personal friends/connections and the help of South Sound Sea Hawkers, I was able to collect and distribute over 2100+ pair of socks. The donations went to various charities throughout Pierce County and homeless encampments.

This year I want to spread SOCKS 1000 around throughout the Pacific Northwest by having the Clubs/Groups challenge each other to collect socks within their memberships and community to be distributed out to local charities and/or homeless encampments, in their county.

If you take the SOCKS 1000 challenge, here's what you need to do:

- 1. Ask your club to sign up to collect socks.
- 2. Ask friends, family, employers, businesses to donate warm new socks.
- 3. Do a bit of research within your community for charities that provide clothing help to families. Especially look for charities that help those being sheltered and protected from domestic abuse. Charities that help foster children. Homeless encampments. You get the idea.
- 4. Find a few places within your community that can be DROP OFF sights for socks. A bank or doctors office is great. You can provide a box with a sign (please contact me for the pdf of the DROP OFF box flyer that you can use)
- 5. Collect socks. Keep a count & report to Sylvie, who will post once a week where the counts are for all those that took the challenge. As a way to give everyone a little push.
- 6. On Jan. 31, 2019 get your final count turned in with a list of where you will be distributing socks.
- 7. Once all the numbers and locations have been turned into Sylvie Ward. One group will be given bragging rights and will earn a basket with an autographed football and various other swag items. All these items can be used within your club for giveaways, raffle items or whatever serves your chapter the best. Maybe pick the person that collected the most socks and give them a special item...be creative in your incentives.
