Nominees must be present at the December Central Council meeting, location to be determined. Nominations can still be made.





Proposed

Add: Mandatory for Chapters to publish, via email to chapter membership, meeting minutes within 10 calendar days of the meeting.

Move: From the Board Secretary duties - 'serve as the chair of the Grievance committee'.

Move to the Parliamentarian duties - 'serve as the chair of the Grievance committee'

Add: One member of the Grievance Committee shall be designated as the Assistant Chair. The Assistant Chair shall be selected by the Parliamentarian. The Assistant Chair shall be allowed to attend closed Council meetings when there are active grievances.

Add: All Chapters, except Military, must hold at least one actual meeting per year.

Add: All Chapters, except Military, must have a reasonable defined geographical area. This area may need to be changed with the addition of new Chapters. Sixty percent of members must reside within this area. Central Council has the right to dispute this area and define a reasonable area for the Chapter.

Add: Policy procedure. A procedure where the Full Council can add, amend or delete policies on how certain things administered. This would require no fewer than two Full Council meetings for any type of change. The proposal at the first and voting at the second with amendments being allowed at both meetings.

Certain events, illness or other issues can preclude the Grievance Chair from preforming their duties. This puts in place an alternate to act in his/her capacity. Brian Deren It appears that some Chapters hold no meetings. Brian Deren There is a possibility that a Chapter can remain active without anyone actually still living in the area in which the Chapter was started. Brian Deren There needs to be a way that we can change how we do things without having to always change the bylaws. Examples; Grievance, Field Pass and special membership drives. Comment: This proposal is not intended to remove the ability for individuals responsible for certain things to set a policy. It is suggested to aid the Full Council in setting, amending or removing policies if a need arises. Brian Deren
